Draw your design. Don't forget that your print will be the \_\_\_\_\_\_image from the block, so keep this in mind if you incorporate \_\_\_\_\_\_\_into your design.

Some people prefer to take a permanent marker and shade in all the \_\_\_\_\_\_\_space so it's easy to tell what gets carved out and what stays.
