COURSE CONTENT AND DELIVERY

YEAR 10

You will cover two coursework units in year 10. The first of these will be;

R022 – Communicating and working with individuals in health, social care and early years settings

YEAR 11

In year 11 you will work towards completing the exam unit. The exam will take place in the summer. The exam topic will be;

R021 – Essential values of care for use with individuals in care settings
