Dear parents and carers,

This has been a fantastic week at CNS. On Thursday we welcomed Bishop David and a number of our local clergy into school to celebrate the Year 7 Mass of Welcome. It was also wonderful to have headteachers from all our Catholic Primary feeder schools here as well. Bishop David then went to the new St Brigid's centre and blessed each room and spent time with the staff and children from the centre. It was also wonderful to welcome Noel Hogan who served our community for so many years (the courtyard in St. Brigid's is named in honour of him and his service), he looked very spritely for being 91 years old! The clergy from the local parishes all had tours around the school focusing on their 'link' year groups which they thoroughly enjoyed.
