Dear parents and carers,

Thank you for your understanding and messages of support this past week as we navigate the situation with the original construction of the main block. Following a week of meetings with the Department for Education, Luton Borough Council, Northampton Diocese and the St Thomas Catholic Academy Trust we are developing a plan to move forward.

The issue with the main block remains the same. There is concern over the construction of the floors in the building and the concrete blocks that were used in the 1960s. These are not RAAC but appear to have reached a point where some are no longer fulfilling their purpose, and there is a small risk of falling debris. The concrete beams throughout the block are not compromised. We are therefore looking at putting in structures to mitigate against any risk of the falling debris. We are seeking expertise from many professionals in different capacities to ensure that whatever action we take is taken under the best possible advice. This includes structural engineers as well as concrete specialists.

Next week we will continue with the same arrangements as this week. Years 7-10 will remain at home and participate in on-line learning and Years 11-13 will remain in school.

Year 7-10 have engaged brilliantly in their online lessons and the attendance is exceptional, with over 80% of students attending all their online lessons. I couldn't be more proud of all of them. This morning I did a brief assembly with over 750 students attending online, this is tremendous.
