### Antigone

Our first trip of the term was with our Year 12 and 13 A' Level Drama and Theatre students to see a contemporary production of the Greek classic, 'Antigone', which is one of their set texts.

It was performed at the Regents Park Open Air Theatre in London on Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> September and had a strong physical theatre influence. The students thoroughly enjoyed the experience, and it gave them much to consider when reflecting on modern adaptations of classic texts.



#### Solomon Theatre Company

On Monday 31<sup>st</sup> October, our KS4V-Cert Performance Skills, GCSE Drama and Year 12 A' Level groups watched a performance of, 'Last Orders', performed by the Solomon Theatre Company. They are a touring company and we invited them into school as part of the students' exam preparation.

The theatre in education company create and perform plays for specific age groups and 'Last Orders' focused on the potential risks of alcohol consumption in young people.

The students were really engaged in the performance and had the opportunity to take part in a workshop with the cast afterwards.

#### **An Inspector Calls**

As part of their 'Live Theatre Evaluation', Year 13 Drama students had the opportunity to see the National Theatre's production of, 'An Inspector Calls', performed at The Alexandra Theatre, Birmingham on Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> December.

It was an impressive adaptation of a very popular play that is widely studied in schools and led to much discussion within the group on the key themes of accountability, conscience, class and the impact on society. As always, our students are a model of good behaviour when representing Cardinal Newman on external visits.





#### Exams

Examinations began on Friday 11<sup>th</sup> November with the Year 13 group performing their own devised pieces of theatre as part of their Component 2 module. There were two groups, and both performed extremely well exploring important and sensitive topics such as the role of women in contemporary society and the human impact of the Grenfell Tower disaster. Both pieces incorporated strong physical theatre influences and reflected their practical studies on, 'Frantic Assembly', their chosen practitioner. They had an audience of Year 11 GCSE Drama students who benefitted greatly from being able to view examples of good practice which they were able to explore in their own work.

The Year 11 students took to the stage next, with their Component 2 examinations taking place on Monday 21<sup>st</sup> November. It was a full and busy day of performances, but they all rose to the occasion, supporting each other and performing to the best of their abilities. Both year groups performed very well and did themselves, their teachers and the school proud.

## MATHEMATICS

#### Maths Week

It was an exciting time for our Key Stage 3 students during Maths Week England 2022. Students in Year 7, 8 and 9 had a great time taking part in this year's Times Table Rock Star competition. Most classes were able to compete against 28,289 other classes across England. With almost 4000 schools signing up we were 661 on the leader board for the number of total correct answers.

As a school, our participating students answered 78,577 questions correctly! CNS's top two classes were 8tMa2 with 15,265 correct answers and 9bMa1 with 10,213 correct answers. Our top CNS student with the most correct answers is Miles Clark in 9bMa1 answering a whopping 4,822 correctly, followed by Shaye in Year 7 and David in Year 8. So, a huge well done to all involved!
