Key Stage 3

At Cardinal Newman students have five one-hour lessons of RE every two weeks. In keeping with the Bishops' Curriculum Directory, approved by the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, we use the Way, the Truth and the Life series, supported by different resources to enable our students to explore Christian beliefs and practice according to the Roman Catholic Tradition.

What are the lesson activities?

During lesson time pupils will be involved in a range of activities including discussion, pair work, group work, role play and research from books and the Internet.

Independent Study

Independent Study is set regularly each half term and can be accessed on the school's Virtual Learning Environment on the school website. This involves a range of activities including reading, research, and project work and preparing presentations.

Assessment

Pupils' Independent Study and class work are assessed continually during the term. There are three formal assessments in RE during the year, one each term.

Prayer and Reflection in RE.

We begin each lesson with a prayer and as far as possible we follow the liturgical calendar, drawing the students' attention to the seasons of the Church's year and Feasts and incorporating this into our prayer.

We believe that faith is 'caught' not 'taught' and so we strive, as best we can, in our words and above all in our actions to reflect the Gospel message to our students:

"You must live your whole life according to the Christ you have received – Jesus the Lord; you must be rooted in him and built on him and held firm by the faith you have been taught and full of thanksgiving." (Colossians 2:6-7)

Key Stage 4

Students have five one-hour lessons of RE every two weeks. We follow the WJEC Eduqas GCSE courses in Religious Studies.

We teach these courses because we believe they offer an exciting and relevant opportunity for students to explore their faith and consider religious and other responses to important moral and social issues. Students will also get the opportunity to study other faiths including Judaism.

Key Stage 5

All students are given the opportunity to develop their faith in the Sixth Form through retreats, RE lessons and conferences. A healthy number of students take up the OCR Philosophy and Ethics A-level course.
